

## Holy Week Schedule (as of 4-2023)

What follows is the schedule for Mary's Little Remnant. If you have a Catholic priest to conduct the prayers and services for Holy Week, then you must follow his schedule. Do all shopping before Maundy Day

### Spy Day

- 1) **12:00 pm:** Mass prayers, which includes the Passion reading from one gospel (cycle through the four Gospels every four years)

### Maundy Day

- 1) **3:00 pm:** Mass prayers
- 2) Sing *Pange Lingua*
- 3) 5 Our Father's and 5 Hail Mary's in thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist; and 1 Our Father and 1 Hail Mary for the Holy Roman Pontiff (or if the Holy See is vacant, for the papacy and a future Roman Pontiff)
- 4) Dinner
- 5) Stripping of the altar
- 6) Readings and the Washing of the Feet
- 7) Maundy Day Tenebrae (replaces Compline)
- 8) **12:00 am:** Night Vigil from midnight to 6:00 in the main church. The Vigil is separated into one-hour vigils in which, if possible, one person must be present during each hour of the Vigil. Each person must pray the Holy Hour on his own within this time period either in the church or his home. After the Holy Hour, the yearly through examination of conscience must be done, such as contained in *The Catholic Prayer Book*.

### Good Sixth Weekday

- 1) Mass of the Pre-sanctified if a Catholic priest is available. There is no actual Mass. During this service, only the priest receives the Holy Eucharist which was consecrated on Maundy Day
- 2) **11:30 am:** Meet at Mary's Little House
- 3) Veneration of the Cross; sing or read *Crux Fidelis*; uncover the crucifixes when possible

- 4) Procession from MLH to MLR, 4.5 miles; silence until 2:30 pm when Stations begin.
- 5) **2:30 pm:** Stations of the Cross, followed by the conclusion of *Stabat Mater*
- 6) The Solemn Prayers
- 7) 5 Our Father's and 5 Hail Mary's in thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist; and 1 Our Father and 1 Hail Mary for the Holy Roman Pontiff (or if the Holy See is vacant, for the papacy and a future Roman Pontiff)
- 8) Dinner
- 9) Good Sixth Weekday Tenebrae (replaces Compline)

### Holy Seventh Weekday

- 1) **3:00 pm:** Prophecies
- 2) Catechumens are received into the Church. Penitents are absolved; but if they were outside the Catholic Church, they are first received into the Catholic Church.
- 3) Dinner
- 4) Holy Seventh Weekday Tenebrae (replaces Compline)
- 5) Unveil statues and pictures before retiring

### Resurrection Day

- 1) **Thirty minutes before sunrise:** Earthquake sound effects; New Fire; procession into the church
- 2) Light Paschal Candle
- 3) Litany of the Saints
- 4) Mass; hymns
- 5) **11:00 am:** Lecture
- 6) Dinner
- 7) Special Vespers
- 8) Dessert
- 9) Recreation or rest time
- 10) **Around 7:00 pm:** Compline
- 11) Movie
