On Faithful Jew and Faithful Gentiles

Question to RJMI:

Mr. X,

I already saw the video where he [RJMI] places the "faithful" Jews above all other Catholics. Seriously? That's more than enough for me to know where he is coming from. Please ask him what Jewish convert since the time of the Apostles was greater spiritually than St. Francis.

RJMI's Reply:

Dear Mr. X.

When I get attacked by Jewish racists and white racists, I know I must be doing something right. I am not saying Mr. X is racist against Jews but it seems that way.

The quote he is referring to is in my video/audio *The Conspiracies of the Jews*, Part 1 at the 6:24 mark. I will paraphrase the first part and quote the other part:

[The Jewish race is the only race that God chose above all others.] "So the faithful Jews are most blessed above all."

I do not take kindly to those who take my teachings out of context. Firstly, he added to my words "since the time of the Apostles." I was speaking of faithful Jews from both the Old and New Covenant eras.

Surely, Mr. X, you would have to agree that faithful Jews (such as Jesus, Mary, Joseph, Moses, Elias, and St. John the Baptist) are more blessed than the faithful Gentile St. Francis of Assisi. In fact, the holiest and most blessed of all of God's creatures are these faithful Jews. That is the point I was making, not that every faithful Jew is more blessed than every faithful Gentile. I was speaking in general terms. Hence, no doubt, there are some faithful Gentiles who are more blessed than some faithful Jews. And it is true that after the time of the apostles there were very few Jewish converts. But there were some, and some of them could very well have been more blessed than St. Francis. And it is also certain that St. Francis is more blessed than many faithful Jews.

Also, it is dogma that the only race God uniquely choose was the Israelite race. In fact, God used that race to bring about the redemption and thus salvation, for Jesus said, "Salvation is of the Jews." (Jn. 4:22) And in Romans 11, St. Paul says faithful Jews are the root of the tree and faithful Gentiles are the branches. And, in that chapter, he warns faithful Gentiles not to be highminded against the Jews just because many of them rejected God.

That being said, the Jews are no longer God's chosen people. The only chosen people during the New Covenant era are Catholics, both Jewish Catholics and Gentile Catholics. However, the Jewish race is still God's most beloved race, as God himself, Jesus Christ, and the Blessed Virgin Mary are Jews. Be careful of the sin of racism, which is rooted in pride, jealousy, and envy. They are the same sins that caused Lucifer to fall from heaven because he wanted to be God's most loved and blessed creature instead of Mary. I go over all these things in detail in my *Brief on God's Chosen People and Church*. And see my Bible commentaries on Roman, Chapter 11.

Lastly, you said, "That's more than enough for me to know where he [RJMI] is coming from." Now you know where I am coming from. And if you think that I justify and glorify apostate Jews after seeing all my works, you have to be either insane or a pathological liar or an infiltrator who is trying to ruin my reputation among good willed men. Many of my Catholic brothers are Gentiles, and I am a Catholic Jew; and I hope they are or become more holy and blessed than me. That would be a cause for me to rejoice and not be jealous or envious. And I certainly can never be more holy and blessed than Jesus and Mary, let alone many other saints.
