

Holy Week Schedule 2014

Spy Day

- 1) **4:30 pm** – Vespers followed by dinner
- 2) **8:00 pm** – Tenebrae (anticipated)

Maundy Day

- 1) **12:00 pm** – Noon prayers and None
- 2) **3:00 pm** – Mass prayers
- 3) Sing *Pange Lingua*
- 4) 5 Our Father's and 5 Hail Mary's in thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist; and 1 Our Father and 1 Hail Mary for the Holy Roman Pontiff (or if the Holy See is vacant, for the papacy and a future Roman Pontiff)
- 5) **4:30 pm** – Special Vespers followed by dinner
- 6) **7:00 pm** – Stripping of altar
- 7) Readings and the Washing of feet
- 8) Tenebrae (anticipated)
- 9) **12:00 am** – Night Vigil from midnight to 6:00 am at MLR and MLH (during which the Holy Hour and the examination of conscience is to be made)

Good Sixth Weekday

No Mass; only the Priest receives Host consecrated on Maundy Day.*

- 1) **11:45 am** – Meet at MLH: noon prayers
- 2) **12:00 pm** – Veneration of the Cross; sing or read *Crux Fidelis*; uncover the crucifixes as soon as possible
- 3) Procession from MLH to MLR 4.5 miles; silence during procession till 3 pm
- 4) **3:00 pm** – Stations of the Cross followed by remainder of *Stabat Mater*
- 5) **4:30 pm** – Special Vespers followed by dinner
- 6) **7:00 pm** – Readings and Solemn Prayers
- 7) Omit Mass of Pre-sanctified
- 8) 5 Our Father's and 5 Hail Mary's in thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist; and 1 Our Father and 1

Hail Mary for the Holy Roman Pontiff (or if the Holy See is vacant, for the papacy and a future Roman Pontiff)

- 9) Tenebrae (anticipated); blow out candle and no earthquake sound because Christ does not rise until Resurrection Day.

Holy Seventh Weekday

- 1) Morning: Scrutinies
- 2) Morning: Priest blesses doors of homes with holy water*
- 3) Noon prayers and None
- 4) **3:00 pm** – Prophecies
- 5) Blessing of Font*
- 6) Catechumens come into the Church
- 7) **4:30 pm** – Special vespers (RJMI) followed by dinner
- 8) **7:00 pm** – Compline (Antiphon II for the BVM) followed by choir practice
- 9) Unveil statues and pictures before retiring

Resurrection Day

- 1) **5:30 am** – Earthquake sound effects, New Fire, and Procession into Church
- 2) Light Paschal Candle
- 3) Litany of Saints
- 4) Mass prayers, Hymns
- 5) Rest time
- 6) **11:00 am** – Rosary and Sermon
- 7) Dinner
- 8) Special Vespers
- 9) Dessert
- 10) Recreation or rest time
- 11) **6:00 pm** - Compline
- 12) Movie

Notes: Do all shopping before Maundy Day.

*This only applies when a Catholic Priest is available.
